The difference you are making

Helping people build their financial resilience is at the heart of YBS Purpose and by fundraising and supporting our partnership with Age UK and our fundraising activity such as YBS Fest, you are really making a difference.

Since launching the Building Better Lives programme, Age UK have supported **3148** older people who have experienced life-changing events and worked with them to improve their situation and plan for their future. Age UK have submitted **2523** benefit claims to help older people access the finances that they are entitled to. To date **over £5.1 million** have been confirmed, an average of £1704 per person supported through the programme - People just like **Shirley**.

Shirley (74) got in touch with Age UK as she was worrying about the rising cost of her utility bills.

Shirley has various health conditions, including arthritis and an enlarged left aorta. Due to these conditions Shirley has some physical limitations, her balance is not good, and she is in pain and has to walk slowly and gets out of breath, despite



having some aids to help her. One of Shirley's conditions affects her bones and she has been advised to keep her heating on to help her manage these symptoms but with the energy prices rising Shirley was worrying about how she would be able to cover the bills.

Following an in-depth discussion with an advisor and a successful review and application, Shirley is now in receipt of the higher rate Attendance Allowance. "I am so chuffed and really appreciate your help. I am so glad I managed to find you – the extra income means so much to me and my husband. This will really help to cover the bills."
